This year they are celebrating our 50th anniversary of service to the community!



In addition to their Helpline, their services span Family Law, Financial Stability, Counseling, and a Girls Lead program. These services are still being delivered at little to no cost. Over the past 50 years, WRC has helped an estimated 30,000 women and girls in Greater Philadelphia.

Helping women and girls overcome difficult life transitions, the nonprofits, people, and agencies that refer clients to them to assist, the particular challenges women and girls face across their lives, these are all steady features of WRC mission's landscape.


WBA SCHOLARSHIP - SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATIONS NOW

IN MEMORY - JOHN PATRICK "PAT" SHANNON, SR.

John Patrick "Pat" Shannon Sr., 80, of Galloway, NJ went home to be with the Lord on Tuesday, December 3, 2024 surrounded by his loving family. Born in Philadelphia, PA, "Pat" was the loving son of late James Lawrence Shannon Sr., and Elizabeth Marie "Bessie" (Taggart) Shannon.

Pat's educational years were deeply rooted in Catholic education. It was during these early years that Pat learned the value of serving others. In his late teens, Pat worked odd jobs such as painting houses, repairing cars, and selling Christmas trees; but these jobs did not suit him. His desire was to interact and work directly with the public. Pat showed an interest in learning the art of Barbering.

So, with the help and sponsorship of the late Jerry the Barber from East Falls, PA, Pat attended The Tri-City Barber School on 9th & Race in Center City in 1964.

Upon completion, Pat found his passion and lifelong profession as a Barber at the age of 22. Professionally and affectionately known as "Pat the Barber", he started cutting hair in 1966 in Philadelphia at Normandy Square Mall on Roosevelt Blvd. He then cut hair at Villanova University.

In 1975, Pat partnered up with another Barber, but soon after his partner moved. Then Pat's Barber Shop was born on the Main Line, owned and operated as a one man show in the thriving area of Radnor Township, Wayne for 48 years.

Adored by his clients, Pat was always known as the best barber in town and received many awards and much recognition during his career. He had a very strong work ethic and worked long days sharing his gift of gab, his love of sports, and his wisdom to his clients. Pat drew in men of all ages, who were blue collar, white collar, families, young children, and even occasionally women. He took great pride when the boys attending the Valley Forge Military Academy stopped by for a high-and-tight fade. Pat never turned a client away no matter what time of day. In the winter of 2023 at the age of 79, Pat reluctantly retired his clippers, combs, and scissors due to illness.

Pat was an extremely devoted family man, who wasn't short of any bragging rights when it came to his four grandchildren. They were the light of his life. Pat was also a very loyal and devoted son to his late mother, whom he absolutely adored. He also loved his extended family just as much: all of whom he kept in close contact with throughout his lifetime. Many became lifelong, loving friends.

Generosity being one of Pat's greatest attributes, he supported many charities, especially ones affiliated with Radnor Schools. He gave to organizations such as the Radnor Little League, Saint Katharine's Church, St. Joe's Prep, and others. Pat was also a member of the Wayne Business Association.

Pat was an avid Philadelphia sports fan, and very well-versed in any stat related to sports. His favorite team was the Philadelphia Eagles. Pat was also very fond of college football and Villanova basketball. He was an avid reader and loved movies, especially mob movies. He was a real foodie who enjoyed home cooked family meals and loved Italian dishes most. He also loved dining out, which he often did together with family. Pat's favorite physical activity was his daily walks.

Besides Wayne, PA, Pat's favorite town was Brigantine, NJ. It was his home away from home where he spent his time off every weekend resting. On his weekly drives home to the shore, Pat made many stops along the way, as he never arrived empty handed. He was always so eager to bring his children fresh baked sweets, rye and Italian breads, tomato pies, cheeses, deli meats, and other treats from his favorite spots in Philadelphia.

Pat enjoyed many activities and holidays at the shore with his children and grandchildren. There were many outings to local events, visits to the AC and OC Boardwalk, and he also liked to frequent the casinos. Pat loved summers at the beach. He also enjoyed activities such as boating and fishing together with his family.

Pat embodied many positive attributes, as he was hard working and very loyal. He was very respectful, kindhearted, patient, tenacious, and resilient. He was a selfless man who possessed more fortitude than we thought humanly possible. Pat was truly the patriarch to his children and grandchildren.
